Consequently, ATA Carnets are necessary for temporary admission operations in the Faroe Islands for enterprises coming from other countries of the European Union.

The Danish Chamber of Commerce acts as the national guaranteeing organization for the Faroe Islands.

In addition, ATA Carnets are not accepted in Greenland.
