ATA Carnets **are not** accepted for postal traffic

Languages in which Carnets should be completed

English and Malay languages. The Customs may require a translation when the ATA Carnets are completed in any other language.

Replacement carnet

The guaranteeing organization of the issuing country should write to the Malaysian NGO in order to obtain the authorization of the Malaysian customs which is then transmitted to the guaranteeing organization of the issuing country via the Malaysian guaranteeing organization.

Regularization fee requested by Customs

The Malaysian Customs do not charge a regularization fee in disputes settled with evidence different from the re-exportation voucher.

However, they may impose a penalty when goods are re-exported out of the Carnet validity period or without the relevant endorsement on the reexportation voucher.

Customs offices

The following Customs offices are entitled to process ATA Carnets: ports, airports and frontier stations.

Customs clearance of ATA Carnets is available 365 days, 24 hours for main ports and airports. But for clearance during odd hours, please check before entry as customs facilities may not be available.
