Customs would accept the importation of jewellery under ATA Carnet on a case-by-case basis and subject to the following specific conditions:

- only jewellery from well-known and recognized factories, bodies, companies would be authorised and for display purposes exclusively;
- · the items should be
 - wrapped individually and boxed with a reference label and price
 - easily identified and catalogued;
- an ATA Carnet with a detailed list of all the items would be required;
- an approval of the Customs authorities prior to importation would be required;
- only importation for a short-term period would be considered;
- importation of jewellery for commercial purposes will not be accepted.
