Application under national laws

The Order of the Minister of External Trade dated 17 February 1962 provides temporary admission facilities in application of the three Conventions listed above ('Professional equipment', 'Exhibition and Fairs', and 'Commercial Samples' Conventions) and also in certain other cases which include:

1. Packings suitable for repeated use whether or not full
2. articles for the personal use of travellers crossing the frontier, if not free of duties or restrictions.

Polish, English or French. The Customs may require a translation when the Carnets are completed in any other language.

Replacement carnet

1. Yes, in accordance with Article 251 Union Customs Code (UCC).
2. When the original carnet expires and a replacement carnet needs to be processed, if the goods are located in Poland, this procedure can take place in Poland even if the initial importation was made in another EU member state.
